

Go to the website www.wordpress.com

make sure you read and agree with the user agreement


Click on the NEXT button at the bottom of the page

SIGN UP CONTINUED


You will then be taken to the next screen

THE TEMPLATE PAGE

On this page you can choose the style of your Blog page – this is called a theme

THE WRITE A POST PAGE

This is where you can start your first Blog

THE HOMEPAGE

This is the page that is visible on the world wide web

When you click on your Homepage it will display automatically with default information.

E.g. If somebody typed in www.acousticguitarist.wordpress.com or was sent the link by email, they would see my Blog homepage

Note how there are no spaces in the address above and also note how the Blog title is flexible and it can be changed at any time.

HELPFUL HINTS

Make sure you save a copy of any of the posts you do to some other storage device. A simple approach would be:

- Create a folder on your hard drive or a pen drive and call the folder "whatever you like Blogs" an example would be "acousticquitarist Blogs"
- Copy the text of your Blog post to a Word .doc
- Name your document with a name that will be easy for you to identify what is in the doc at a later date
- Save the Word doc to your folder full of Blogs
- Keep in mind that an extra backup copy is a good idea
